I invite you to join me and our internal medicine colleagues at *Michigan Internal Medicine 2009*, the annual meeting of the Michigan Chapter of the American College of Physicians, **September 25–27, 2009, at the Grand Traverse Resort in Acme, Michigan**. Scott Kaatz, DO, FACP, and Anna Lukowski, MD, Program Committee co-chairs, have done an excellent job in developing an engaging program for all our members, with an eye toward being attractive to both our generalist practitioner and academic audiences. For good reason, this meeting is referred to as one of the best regional ACP meetings going. Attendees can earn up to 19.75 CME credits and 20 recertification credits, all while networking with friends and colleagues.

Our program will feature the interactive “**Update**” sessions, this year focused on general internal medicine, cardiology, and nephrology. Further, there will be sessions on office and hospital medicine, which may be taken as SEP modules for recertification credit or viewed as updates. David Gilbert, MD, MACP, from Portland, Oregon, will deliver the annual Park Willis III Lecture entitled “Here Comes Procalcitonin.”

A meeting theme this year will be **practice transformation**—what do we need to do to get ready for changes in the way we deliver our internal medicine services? This will involve a plenary, delivered by Michael S. Barr, MD, FACP, ACP Vice President of Practice Advocacy and Improvement, as part of the annual James Hall Lecture, entitled “Internal Medicine in the 21st Century: Challenges, Choices, and Change”. After this lecture we will have two breakout sessions to choose—Practice Transformation in the Office or Implications of the Patient-Centered Medical Home for Medical Education and Research.

Finally, in addition to the **Doctors' Dilemma™** competition organized by Dileep Kumar, MD, FACP, for our residents, we will again feature the two sessions which always highlight the enjoyment we obtain from exercising our diagnostic skills: David Scrase, MD, FACP, will return for the popular “**Thieves' Market**” and Eric Scher, MD, FACP, will again lead the “**Professors in Action**” session where our chief residents try to stump the experts with unknown cases. Concurrent **Special Sessions** will highlight caring for Muslim and limited-English patients, balancing professional demands with those of family responsibilities, and facing the challenges of the physician–pharma interface.

As mentioned, we will again offer two **Self-Evaluation Modules (SEP) for recertification purposes**. On Saturday morning we will offer the Hospital-Based Internal Medicine Update organized by Paul Grant and his University of Michigan colleagues. On Sunday morning, we will offer an Internal Medicine module organized by Mary Nettleman from Michigan State University.

We are happy to be back at the Grand Traverse Resort with its attractions as well as those of the Grand Traverse Bay region, especially at that time of year.
